


Longlisted for the 2022 Ockham New Zealand Book Awards

Christian Harrison



Harrison Christian is a New Zealand journalist and writer. His reporting career has seen him travel extensively in the Pacific and beyond, covering such topics as rising sea levels in Arctic Alaska and the escape of political refugees from China. He is a direct descendant of Bounty mutineer, Fletcher Christian.



Topics of interest include his ancestor Fletcher Christian, the infamous Mutiny on the Bounty, the Pacific.

Full of misadventure and mystery, *Men Without Country* is a sweeping history of exploration and rebellion in the South Seas – told by a direct descendent of Fletcher Christian, the man who led the infamous mutiny on the Bounty. For the first time, *Men Without Country* provides a comprehensive and compelling account of the whole story – from the history of trade and exploration in the South Seas to Pitcairn Island, which provided the mutineers' salvation, and then became their grave. 

Gareth's first novel, *The Traitor and the Thief*, won the 2016 Storylines Tessa Duder Award, the 2018 Sir Julius Vogel Award for Best Youth Novel, a 2018 Storylines Notable Book Award and was a finalist in two categories at the New Zealand Book Awards for Children and Young Adults. His sequel, *The Clockill and the Thief* was the winner of the 2019 Sir Julius Vogel Awards Best Youth Novel category.

Following on from the dramatic events of the first book in *The Rise of the Remarkables* duology, *Brasswitch and Bot*, we find Wrench and Bot on the hunt for Plum with the aid of Thirteen. Gareth is a great performer for school groups and 10-13 year olds.

The Unexpected Patient


Dr Himali McInnes

Liam McIlvanney



Liam McIlvanney was born in Scotland and studied at the universities of Glasgow and Oxford. His novel *Where the Dead Men Go* won the Ngaio Marsh Award for Best Crime Novel.

His most recent book *The Quaker* won the 2018 McIlvanney Prize for Scottish Crime Book of the Year (an award named in honour of Liam's father, a crime writer). He is Stuart Professor of Scottish Studies at the University of Otago and based in Dunedin.

He is a popular participant in crime events and talks.




Sandra Morris


Abbey and Money Singh are better known as The Modern Singhs, Kiwi social media celebrities with a rich and tangled love story to tell.


Chris Long is the son of bestselling authors of *A Life on Gorge River* and *A Wife on Gorge River*.
